I'm praying for you, my family, students, church, the nation and our world during this time of uncertainty. Please join me daily in prayer.



"Rest in God alone, my soul, for my hope comes from him. He alone is my rock and my salvation, my strong-hold; I will not be shaken. My salvation and glory depend on God, my strong rock. My refuge is in God. Trust in him at all times, you people; pour out your hearts before him. God is our refuge." Psalm 62:5-8, CSB

The events of the past several weeks have brought many of our routines to a screeching halt. Our routines and freedoms give us a sense of security and structure that allow us to focus on what is in front of us with little fear or concern. When these routines and freedoms are hindered due to unforeseen circumstances, we are reminded of our own inadequacies and the fragile nature of our existence. In the midst of a world that is coming to grips with this truth, we have a blessed opportunity! We know the God that is unshakable, unchanging, and unaffected by momentary circumstances. We have a Savior who is the exalted, enthroned, Lord Jesus Christ. We have the abiding Holy Spirit who will never leave us nor forsake us. He has set up residence in our hearts.
