They can be as simple as a scripture reading and prayer, or can include singing hymns and praises. Focus and consistency are the goals, not complexity. During the time we have been separated from our corporate gatherings, our family gathering has become deeper and richer. If we are not worshipping with our families now, how will we have the determination or be prepared to institute home worship if persecutions should ever arise?

We have begun to publish a family Bible reading plan to aide you in family worship. This reading schedule supports the memory verses many of us have committed to memorize throughout the year. We are making many video resources available through our Facebook page to give examples and assist you in beginning and continuing family worship in your homes.
